

Special Events Management Plan

Description of Event / Activity:

Kaslo Suffer Fest is an athletic event to be held on September 28 through 30th, 2012. There are kids races that are held entirely on Village land and thus not included in this plan. There are cross country mt bike races, 14km, 45km and 100km in length. Trail run races 10km, 25km, 50km and 200km. Plus the Monster Enduro Mt bike race, pedalling up to the top of Mount Buchanan via logging roads and then down the "Monster" trail all the way to downtown Kaslo.

- 1) Proposed Dates/Duration of event: September 28th through 30th, 2012 from 6am to 7pm. The event will occur in a similar location, on a similar date in subsequent years.
- 2) Anticipated maximum number of participants: 500 Organizers/Volunteers: 200 Spectators: 500
- 3) Admission charged: No fee to spectators. Fees for participants as follows:

- 4) Location of proposed event: (please see attached maps for race routes). For "SHAPE FILES" please contact John Addison at johnadd@gmail.com. Finish area structures, and parking for participants will all be within Village of Kaslo limits. Participants will be shuttled to the start area for the 100k XC, & 10k trail run, so no need for parking control. A portapotty will be placed at the start of the 10k trail run (Airport). There are existing toilet facility at the top of Mt Buchanan, Fish Lake, and New Denver Campground. Kaslo Sufferfest will replace used toilet paper and leave the site clean. There will be signage at all intersections of the race for all races, along with cones and flagging tape where necessary.

- 5) Management of activity (rules, enforcement, safety):

Rules & Regulations

Kids Race: All bike participants must wear a safety approved helmet at all times when on or handling their bike. A free bike check by Kootenay Mountain Sports is recommended prior to the race. 1 Adult (14+) Chaperone per child is allowed but not required. Stay right to allow passing on the left. Please notify other racers when approaching to pass.

Trail Runs: No outside support. Must be self supported other than what is provided at the aid stations. No littering or shortcutting. Any athlete found littering or shortcutting will be immediately disqualified. It is recommended that a water bottle be carried at all times during the race, however not required on the 10k or 25k. Please use trail etiquette – notify a runner in front that you would like to pass, and slower runners stay right to allow faster runners to pass when requested. The faster runner has the right of way.

Bike Races: Must have a safety approved helmet on and buckled at all times when on or handling bike. **FULL FACE HELMET & FINGERED GLOVES MANDATORY FOR MONSTER DH.** A free bike check by Kootenay Mountain Sports is recommended, but not required prior to the race. Self supported other than what is provided at the self-serve aid station at the top of the mountain. No leaving gear on the course before or after the race! Any athlete found shortcutting, stashing gear or littering will be immediately disqualified. Please use trail etiquette – please move off to the side to allow faster rider to pass at first available area. When approaching a rider, please notify the rider that you would like to pass and pass when safe. The faster rider has the right of way.

- 6) Overlap with a Recreational Site or Trail:
The race will take place in a similar fashion to last year, and safety & maintenance/garbage issues will be addressed.

- 7) Overlap with another Land Act tenure:

- 8) Temporary Improvements: No temporary improvements are planned on Crown Land.
Temporary structures will all be within Village Limits.

- 9) Source of water for drinking purposes: Water jugs sterilized with bleach will be filled with tap water from the Village of Kaslo and transported to aid stations along the course.
- 10) Washrooms: A portapotty will be provided by a contractor who will deliver and then pick up and dispose of sewage at appropriate facilities at the Airport location. At Fish Lake, and Mt Buchanan, additional toilet rolls will be brought, and facilities cleaned after usage.
- 11) Garbage & Recycling: Volunteers who are assigned to each aid station are instructed to clean up area completely after race and take to transfer station or recycling depot.
- 12) Potential impacts on the environment and on other users: 15 passenger shuttle vans are used to transfer participants to lessen the traffic & parking needed at race start sites. The race will be advertised in local media for several weeks prior to inform area residents of the event and race routes. Signage on the routes to alert other trail users.
