

Section A – Project Overview

To include 2 sections of historic infill into Shuswap Lake that is currently being used for general industrial purposes. The 2.1 hectare area was filled well over 15 years ago and is currently being used for dewatering of logs and for log storage and handling (i.e. a dryland sort). Section B - Project Description

- I. Background: Historic infill into Shuswap Lake (as old as 1960). Existing use being brought into compliance by extending the lease to include. Department of Fisheries and Oceans is aware.
- II. Location: Canoe – See plans and images. Overview image attached. Other relevant information previously submitted to Keith Weir, Senior Land Officer, Ministry of Forests Lands, and Natural Resource Operations. Keith was to forward to Front Counter, BC.
- III. Utilities: Currently in place. There are 5 buildings which encroach on the fill.

Section C - Additional Information

- I. Environmental
 - a. Land- The area of concern is 2.1 hectares of fill placed within the lake and adjacent to property owned and leased by Federated Co-operatives Limited.
 - b. Atmospheric – There are no atmospheric effects.
 - c. Aquatic – See the Ecoscape Report.
 - d. Fish and Wildlife – See the Ecoscape Report.
- II. Socio-Community
 - a. Land Use – The land is currently being used for dewatering and a log sort. There are 5 buildings which encroach upon the fill. The fill area is contained within the general mill and plywood operations area and will not affect other public uses.
 - b. Socio – Community Conditions – As this area has been used in its current state for over 15 years and it is located within the general mill and plywood operations area there will be no socio community affects.
 - c. Public Health - As this area has been used in its current state for over 15 years and it is located within the general mill and plywood operations area there will be no public health affects.
 - d. First Nations – Ministry notification of relevant first nations is recommended. Splatasin has been provided a copy of the Ecoscape report.
