General Updates (new information)

Staff at the Ministry of Forests, Lands, Natural Resource Operations and Rural Development (FLNRORD) are continuing their review of remaining replacement applications within the Fraser River Transition Area. Target Replacement Timelines (new information)

The following target replacement timelines were shared in April 2017:

Crown Lands Program Area	Target Replacement Date
Community and Institutional	December 31, 2016
Utility	December 31, 2016
Reserves	December 31, 2016
Log Handling and Storage	Spring 2017
Private or Strata Moorage and Residential	Spring 2017
Float Homes	Summer 2017
Commercial Marinas	Summer 2017
Commercial (General Miscellaneous)	Summer 2017
Industrial (General Miscellaneous)	Fall 2017

To date, 45.9% of approximately 294 files within the Fraser River Transition Area have been offered. Approximately 82.3% of these files are at the reported stage and 55.8% have been reviewed.

Staff are continuing to work diligently on the remaining files, and good progress is being made on a weekly basis, despite large volumes of other applications in the South Coast Region, additional provincial priorities (such as wildfire response and recovery), and high staff turnover.

For some files, the Authorizations Specialist is not able to complete the Land Report and make an informed Land Act recommendation to the Statutory Decision Maker because additional information is required from the applicant. This information may include, but is not limited to a comprehensive management plan, a site plan, a replacement application form and fee, or a Statutory Declaration stating that the site is in a clean, safe and sanitary condition.

In such cases, several attempts have been made to contact the applicant and these attempts have been unsuccessful. It is the responsibility of the applicant to keep the Province informed of any changes to their contact information and respond to requests for information regarding the proposed use of Crown land.
